IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The maximum time frame for completion of an Associate degree or a certificate at AWC is **96 credits**. This includes transfer credits and all semesters of enrollment (including summer semesters) whether or not financial aid was received. If you have reached the maximum credits and you have already completed an Associate degree or Certificate, OR if you have **already been denied an appeal** for excessive credits then you are no longer eligible for Financial Aid at AWC. Students waiting for an appeal decision should be fully prepared to assume responsibility for all tuition and fees, regardless of the final decision. This form must be submitted each semester.

A.	A. Financial Aid Department will calculate an adjusted number of credits based on the following criteria. Credits attempted minus ESL / CLEP / Developmental / Military (up to 30). These adjustments are for the sole purpose of determining financial aid eligibility and will not change your transcript.

AWC Excessive Credit Policy

Federal regulations {CFR 668.32(f) and 668.34} require a student to move toward the completion of a degree or certificate within an eligible program when receiving financial aid. Specific requirements for academic progress for financial aid recipients are applied differently than AWC Academic Standards. Federal regulations state that Academic Progress Standards must include a review of all periods of enrollment regardless of whether or not aid was received. The student must meet all of the following minimum standards to receive financial aid.

- Minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA.
- Minimum cumulative completion rate of 75% towards the declared degree/certificate.
- Student must NOT EXCEED maximum timeframe (150%) after which a degree/certificate must be granted.
