PURPOSE

The College seeks to maintain public order and to protect the safety of individuals on campus. It is the intention of Arizona Western College to prohibit the use of weapons or dangerous items on land and in all buildings owned or controlled by the College (“the College Campus”). An individual shall not possess or use firearms, weapons, explosives, fireworks, conducted electrical devices, dangerous chemicals or any other instrument capable of harming any person or property or that reasonably would create the impression of being able to induce such harm, except as set out in this Procedure. A concealed carry permit does not exempt a person from this Procedure.

PROCEDURE

1. Definitions
 - 1.1 *Weapon* means any object or substance designed to inflict a wound, cause injury, or incapacitate, including without limitation all firearms, BB guns, air guns, pellet guns, switchblade or automatic knives, knives with blades five inches or more in length, and chemicals such as mace, tear gas, or oleoresin capsicum (pepper spray) but excluding normally available over-the-counter self-defense repellents. Chemical repellents labeled “for police use only” or “for law enforcement use only” may not be possessed by the general public.
 - 1.2 *Firearm* means any loaded or unloaded handgun, pistol, revolver, rifle, shotgun or other weapon that will or is designed to, or that may readily be converted to, expel a projectile by the action of an explosive.
 - 1.3 *Conducted Electrical Device (CED)* means any device, often known as stun guns, stun batons, or TASERS™, that utilizes electricity to stun or temporarily incapacitate people by causing involuntary muscle contractions to voluntary muscles.

2. Arizona Western College shall place signs in appropriate locations throughout the College Campus to provide faculty, students and visitors with directions regarding this Procedure. This signage shall serve as a reasonable request that prohibits any weapon from College property pursuant to the student code of conduct as outlined by the Board of Regents in 5-303, 5-308 and A.R.S. § 13-2911.A and 13-1502.A1.
 - 2.1 Signs shall read: “Possession of weapons on campus is prohibited subject to certain exceptions. A.R.S.§ 12-781, 13-2911(A) and 13-1502.A1. Information regarding exceptions can be obtained at the Campus Police Department.”

3. Any request to use, possess, display or store a weapon on the College Campus should be made in writing to the College President or designee with a copy sent to the College's Chief of Police. Any such request must be made 10 calendar days prior to the intended date of such use and must identify the following:
 - 3.1 the purpose of the request and how it relates to the College's business
 - 3.2 the weapon
 - 3.3 the duration of the request
 - 3.4 a responsible person
 - 3.5 how the weapon will be secured
 - 3.6 how the weapon will or may be used

With the exception of the items listed in Section 9, if approval is given for an indefinite period of time, it should be reviewed annually. The Campus Police Department will keep all approved requests on file.

4. Any approved request referenced in Section 3 above shall include conditions or restrictions necessary to require safety and consistency with this Procedure, including that all weapons remaining on the College Campus overnight which are part of regularly scheduled sessions of law enforcement courses or other College firearms training courses will be signed in and out and locked in a secure weapons vault while in the custody of the College.
5. Confiscated weapons may be sold, destroyed or otherwise disposed of in accordance with A.R.S. § 13-2911(D) and 13-4301, et seq.
6. Any person who violates this Procedure shall be subject to immediate ejection from the College Campus. Violations of this Procedure by College students, faculty and staff will be considered misconduct, subject to disciplinary action pursuant to College policies and procedures and/or the Student Code of Conduct. Violations of this Procedure may also result in arrest for applicable statutes and confiscation of any weapon or dangerous instrument.
7. The College President, or an officer or employee designated by the President to maintain order, may lawfully order a person in violation of this Procedure to remove any weapon and/or leave the College Campus. Any person who violates this Procedure and who does not

immediately comply with any lawful order to remove a weapon and/or leave the College Campus is subject to arrest and confiscation of the weapon by a peace officer for interference with or disruption of an educational institution. A.R.S. § 13-2911(A), (C), (D), Trespass A.R.S. § 13-1502.A1, and any other applicable statute

8. Exceptions

The prohibition against having a weapon on the College Campus does not apply to the following.

- 8.1 Peace Officers certified by the State of Arizona and currently employed by an Arizona law enforcement agency, regardless of whether they are performing official duties or are off-duty.
- 8.2 Any law enforcement officer working under his or her color of authority.
- 8.3 Weapons used in authorized academic programs for which prior written approval has been obtained from the College President or designee.
- 8.4 Any other activity that has been given prior written approval by the College President or designee.
- 8.5 Any employee, student or visitor may store or transport any legally possessed firearm inside the person’s locked and privately-owned motor vehicle or inside a locked compartment on the person’s privately-owned motorcycle. Such firearm must not be visible from the outside of the motor vehicle or motorcycle.
