Higher Education Pyramid





Areas of Study (Pathways)

- Program Pathways are organized by common areas, also known as Areas of Study or Career Clusters.



Student Financial Aid Responsibilities

Check your "Self-Service" account for updates and communication from Financial Aid.

Enroll only for those classes that apply to the declared program of study.

Maintain satisfactory academic progress each semester.

2.0 minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA)

Cumulative <u>completion rate</u> of at least **65%**Total Completed (finished) Credits

Total Attempted (started) Credits

Maximum number of overall/cumulative credits does not exceed **80 credits**.

To maintain **Satisfactory Academic Progress**, student must not:

Completely withdraw from all classes

- Receive grades of all "NS" and/or "F"
- Exceed the 80 credit maximum

Students will have to repay a part or the entire financial award for classes not attended, dropped, withdrawn or cancelled.


