



10-Year Trend of Total Student Headcount & FTSE



10-Year Trend of Student Headcount (%) by Race/Ethnicity







10-Year Trend of Student Headcount (%) by Enrollment Status¹




Despite the predominance of traditional college-age students, most students attend part-time.

10-Year Trend of Average & Median Student Age






10-Year Trend of Overall Academic Success & Withdrawal Rates





10-Year Trend of Graduates & Credentials Awarded



10-Year Trend of Total Credentials, Degrees, & Certificates Awarded






