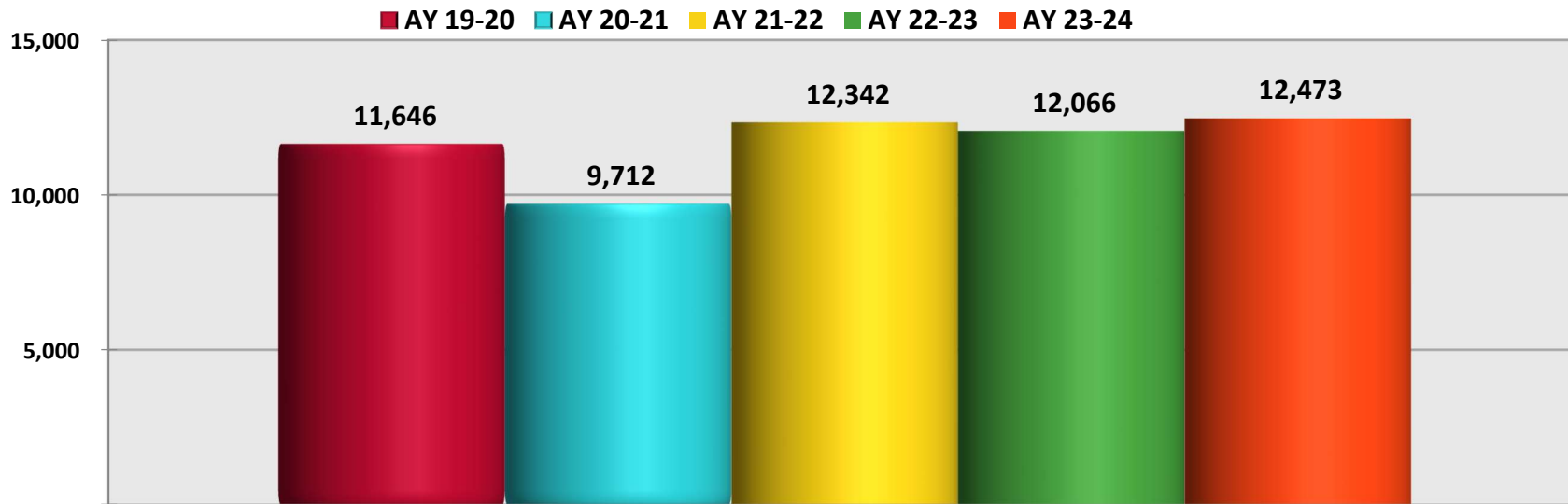

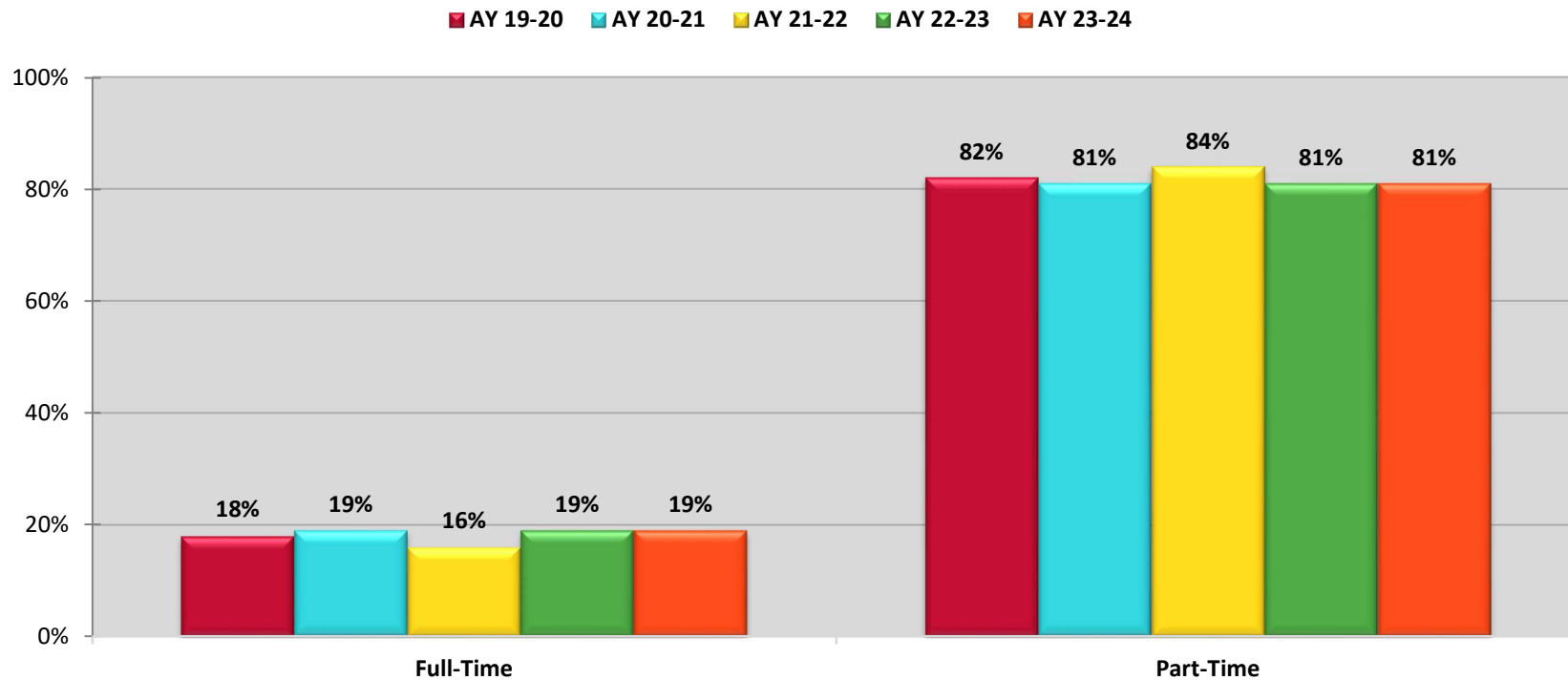

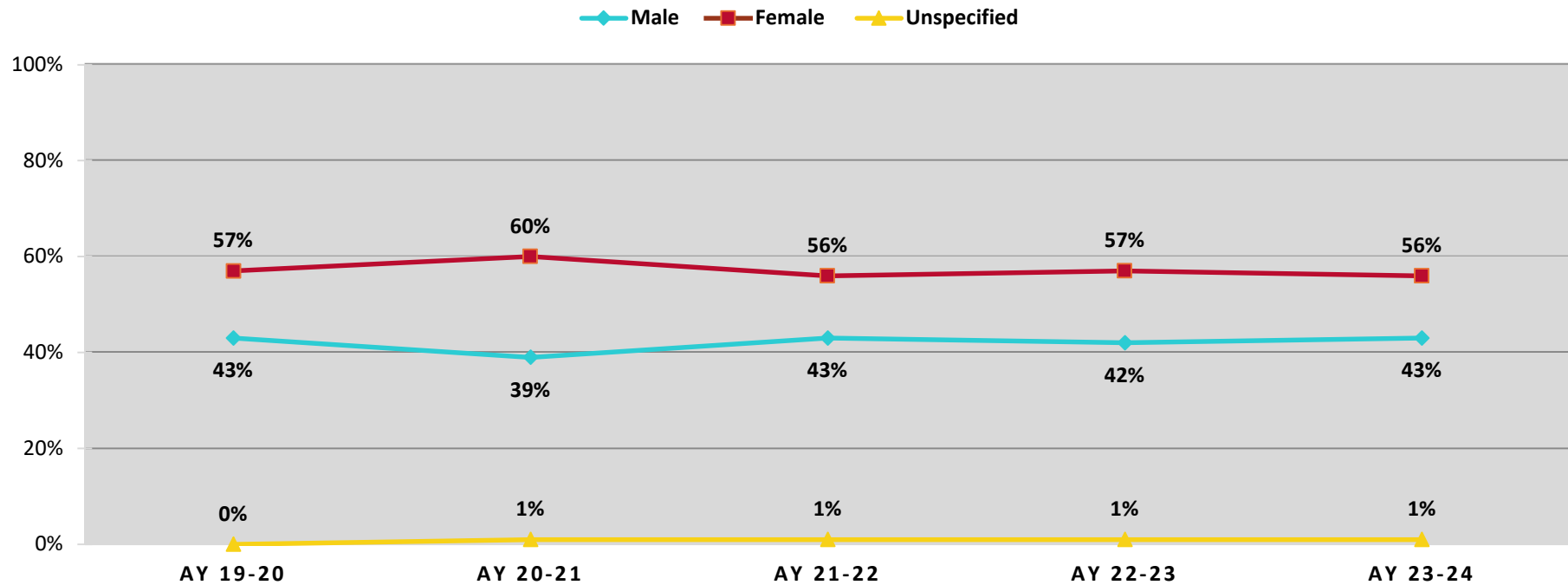

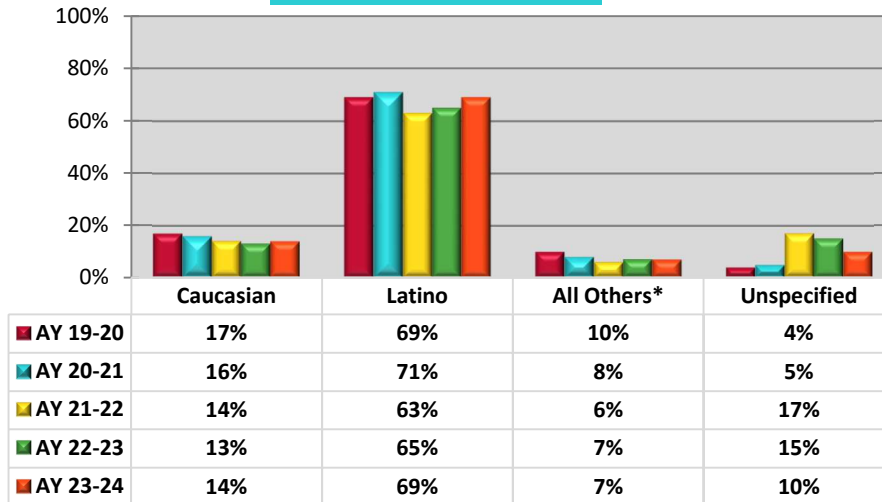

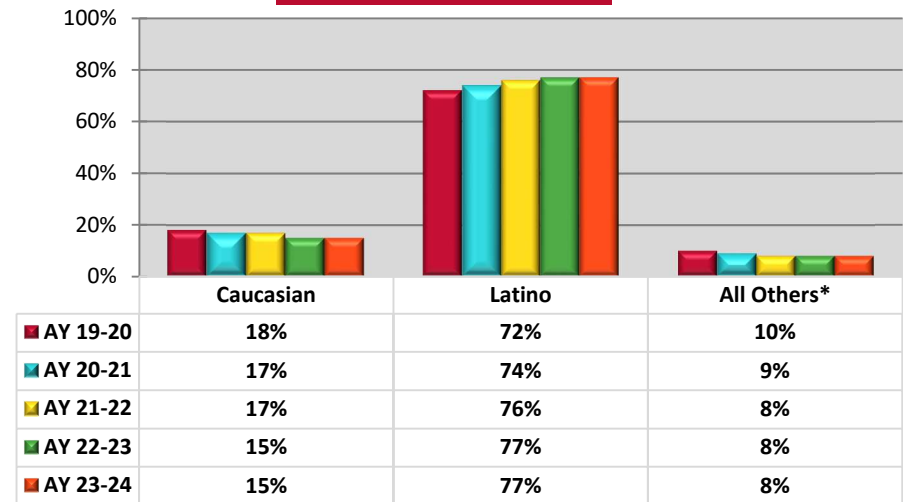

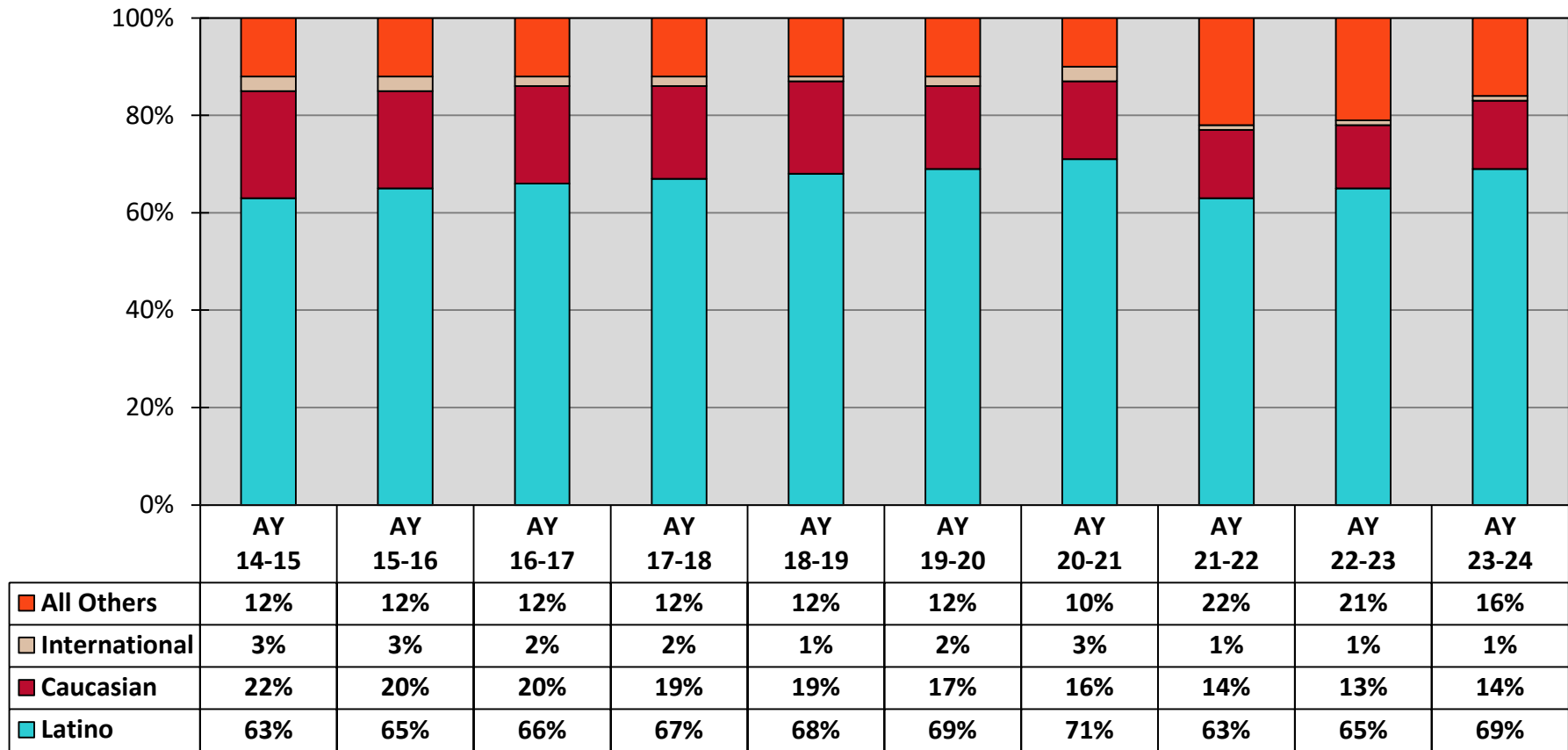

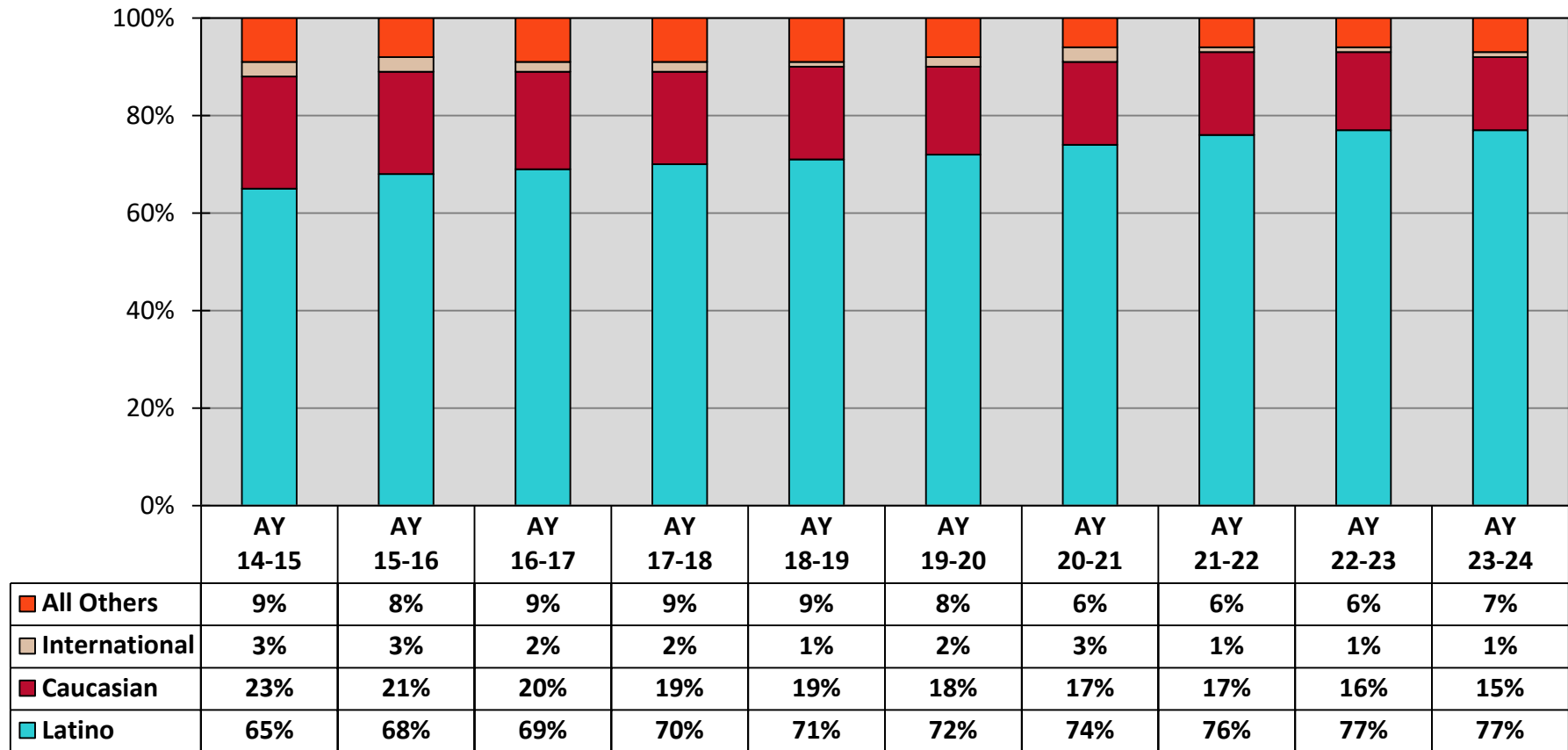

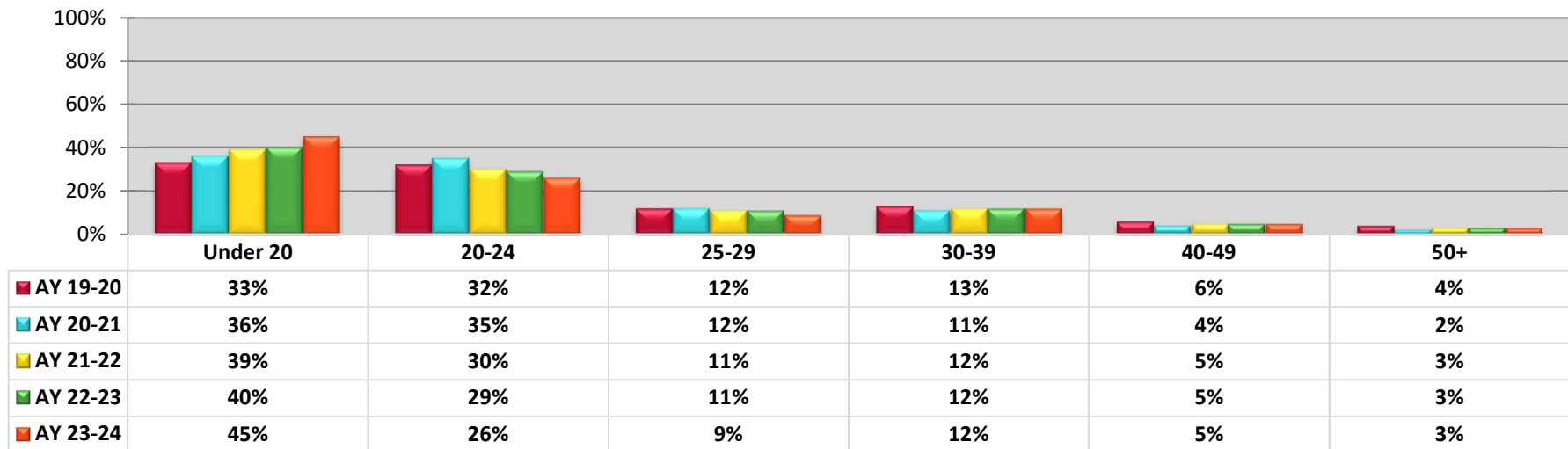

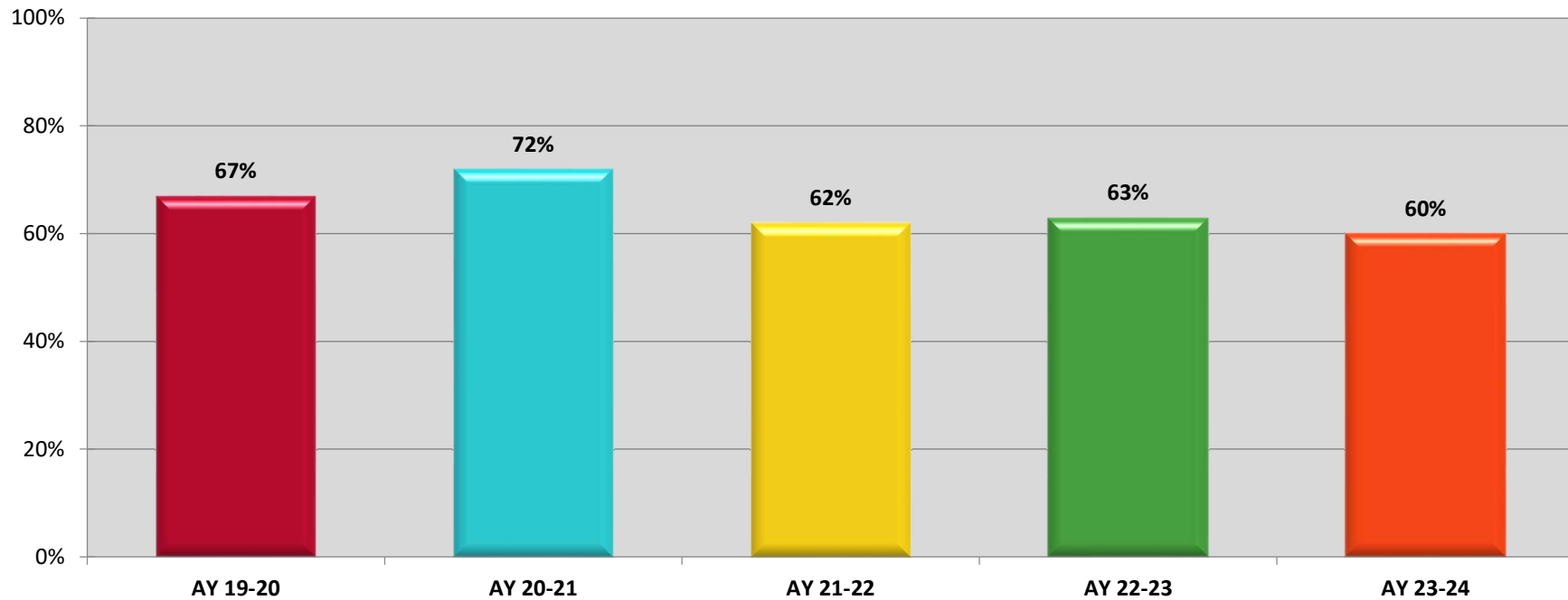

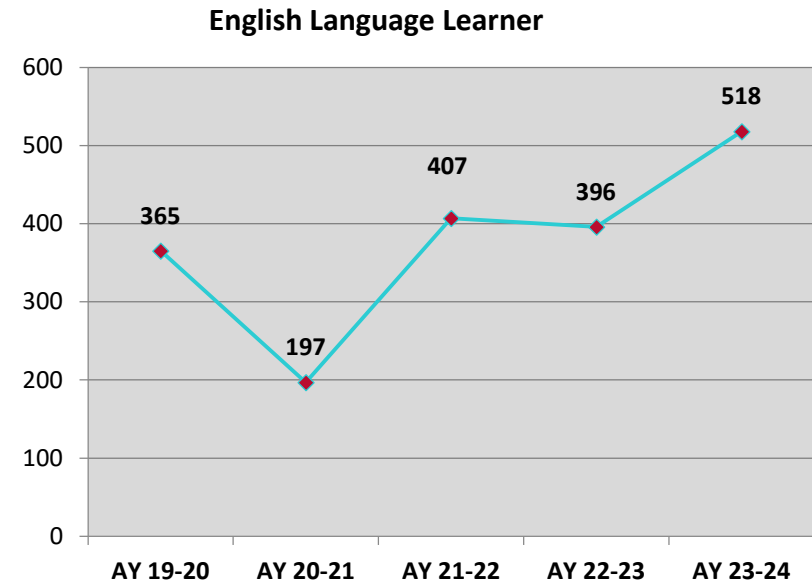

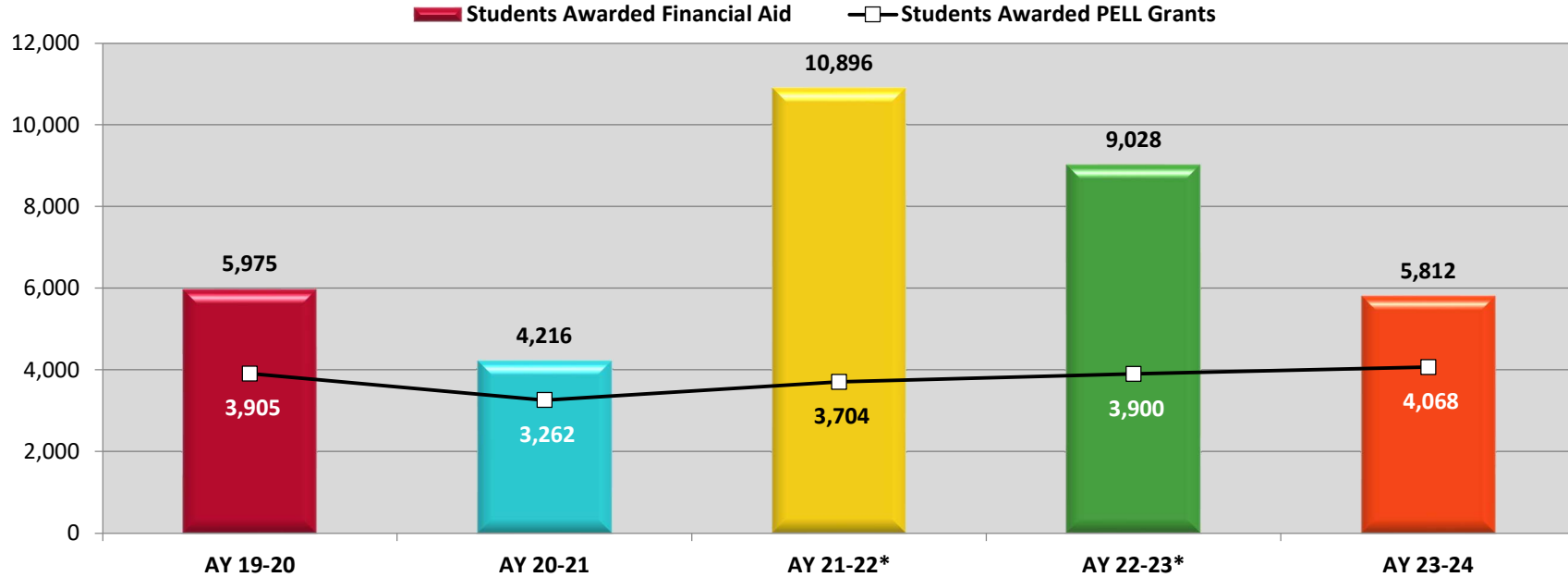

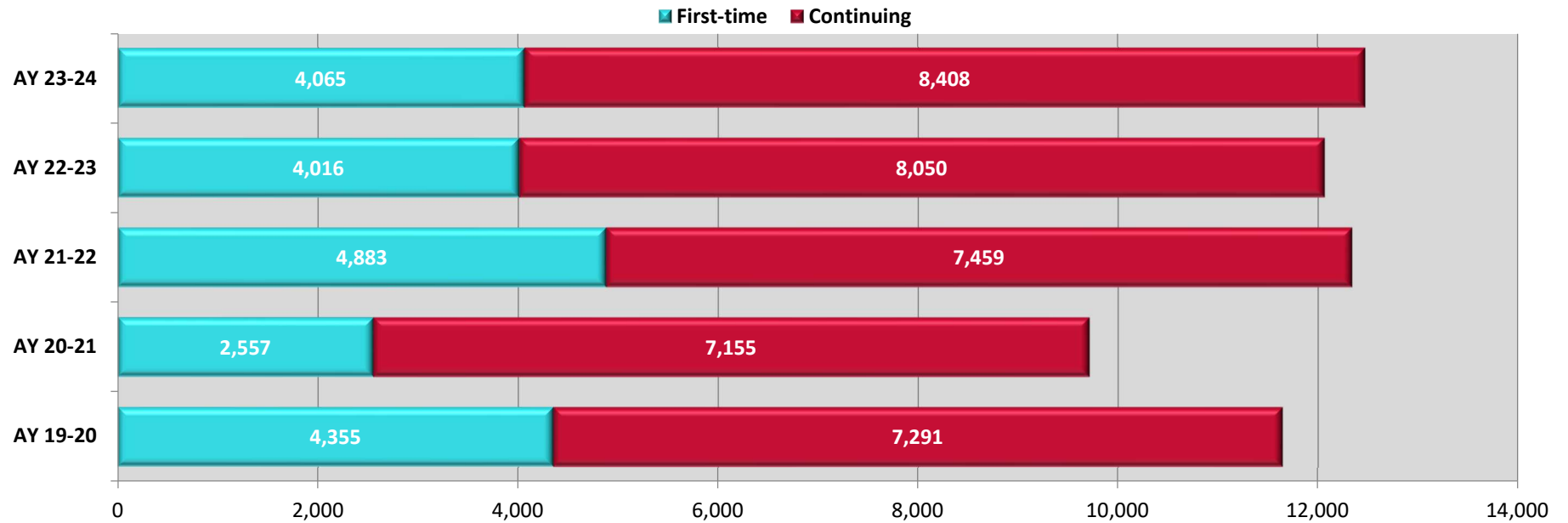

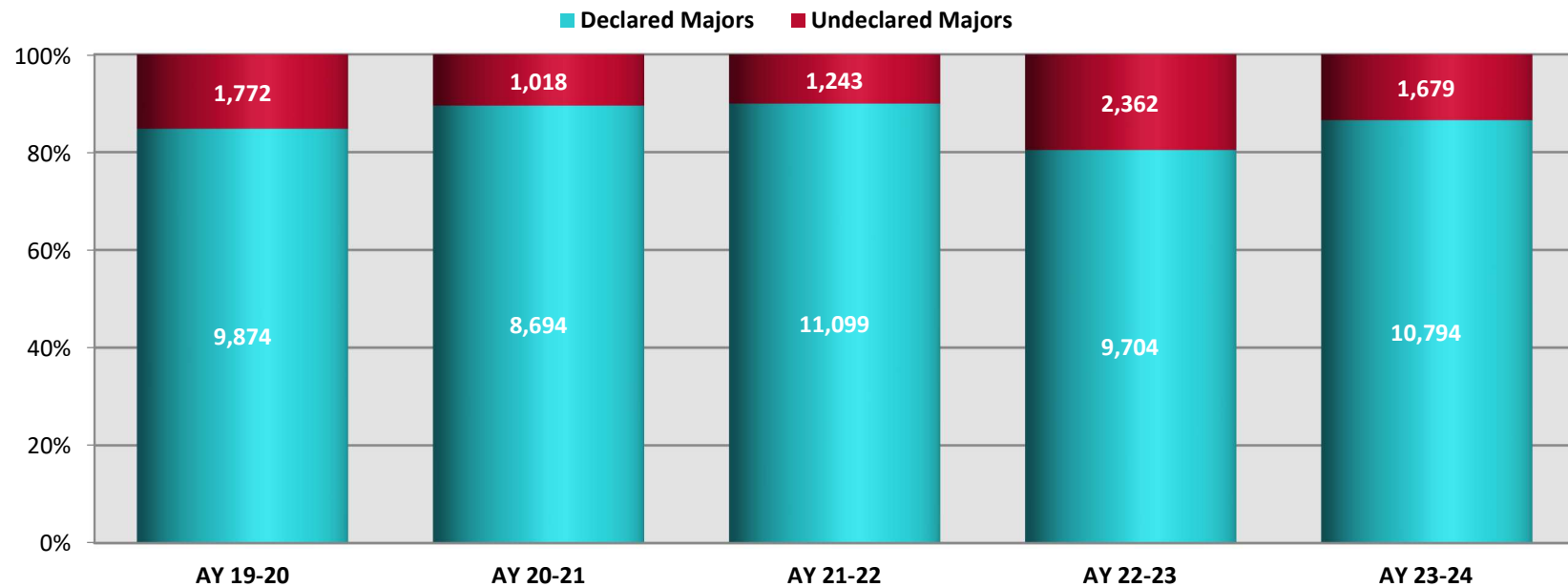

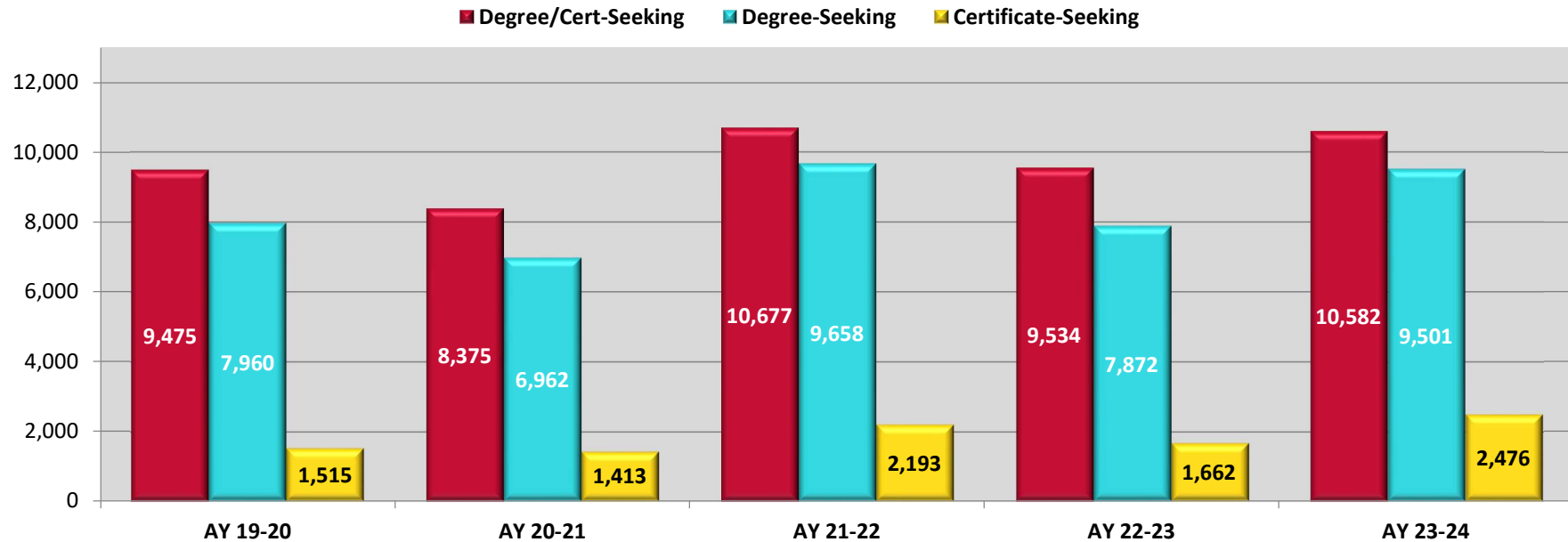

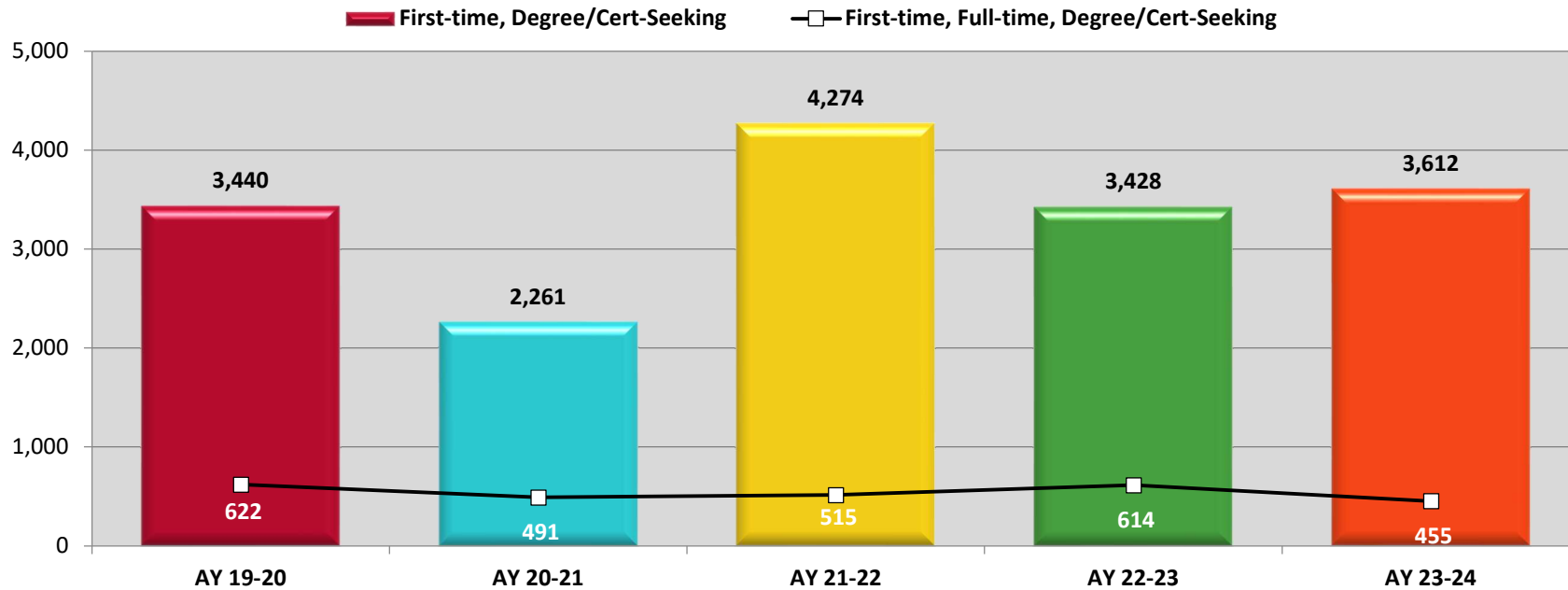

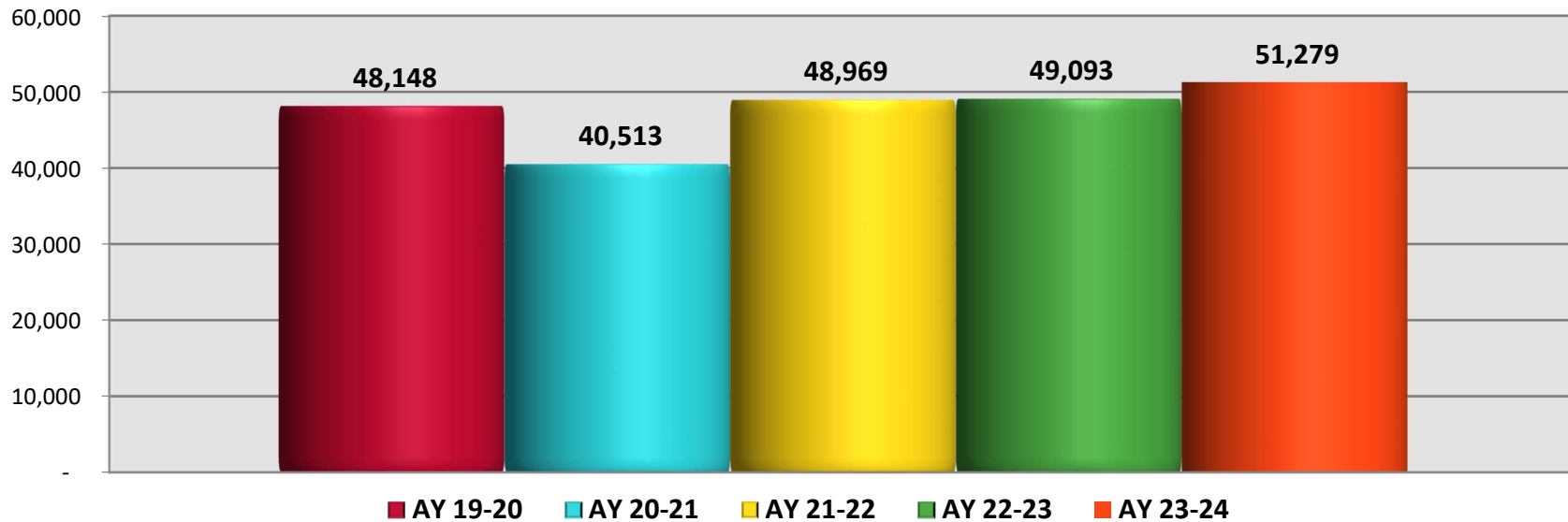

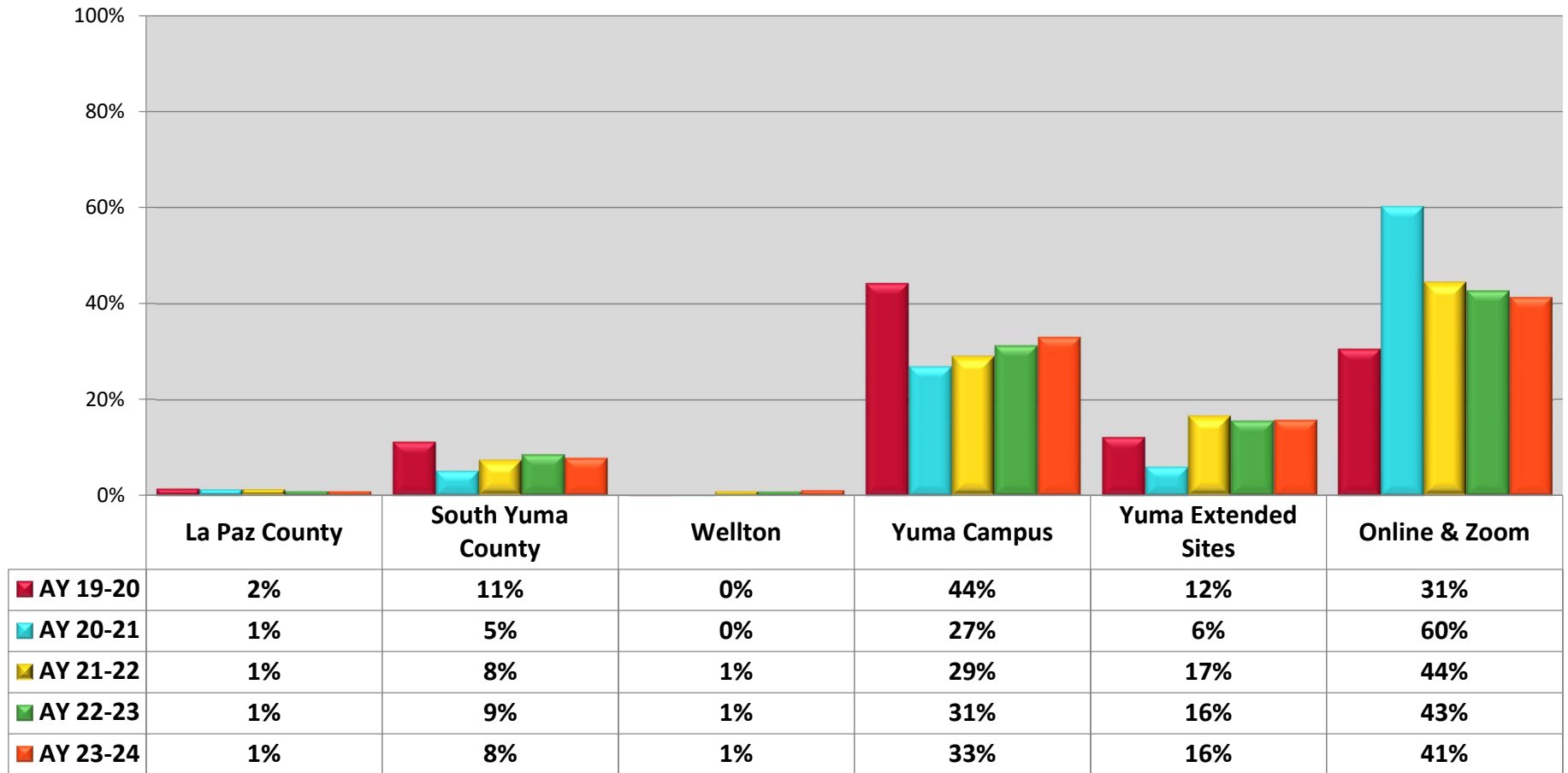

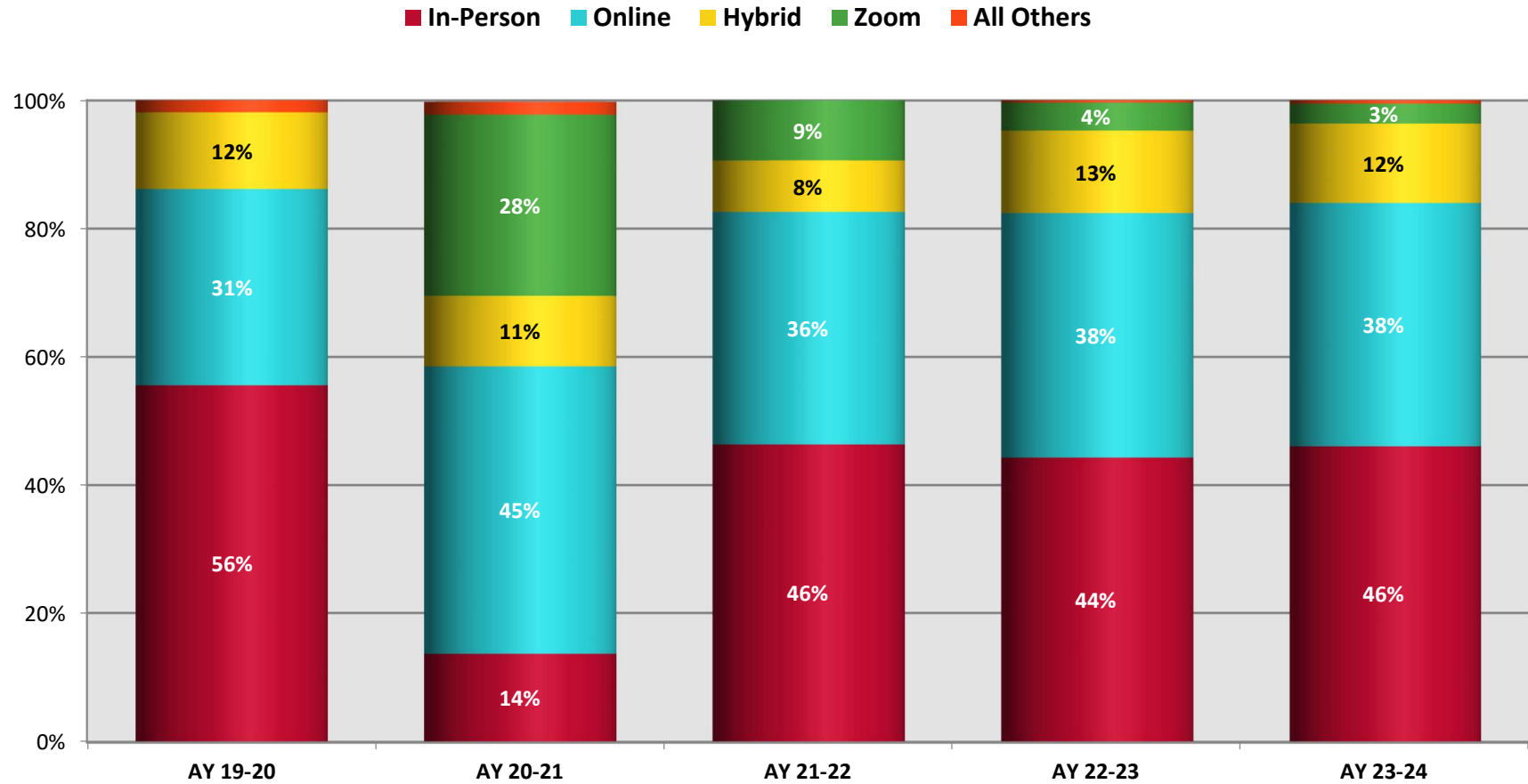

Five-Year Trend of Total Enrollment Headcount¹ by Modality



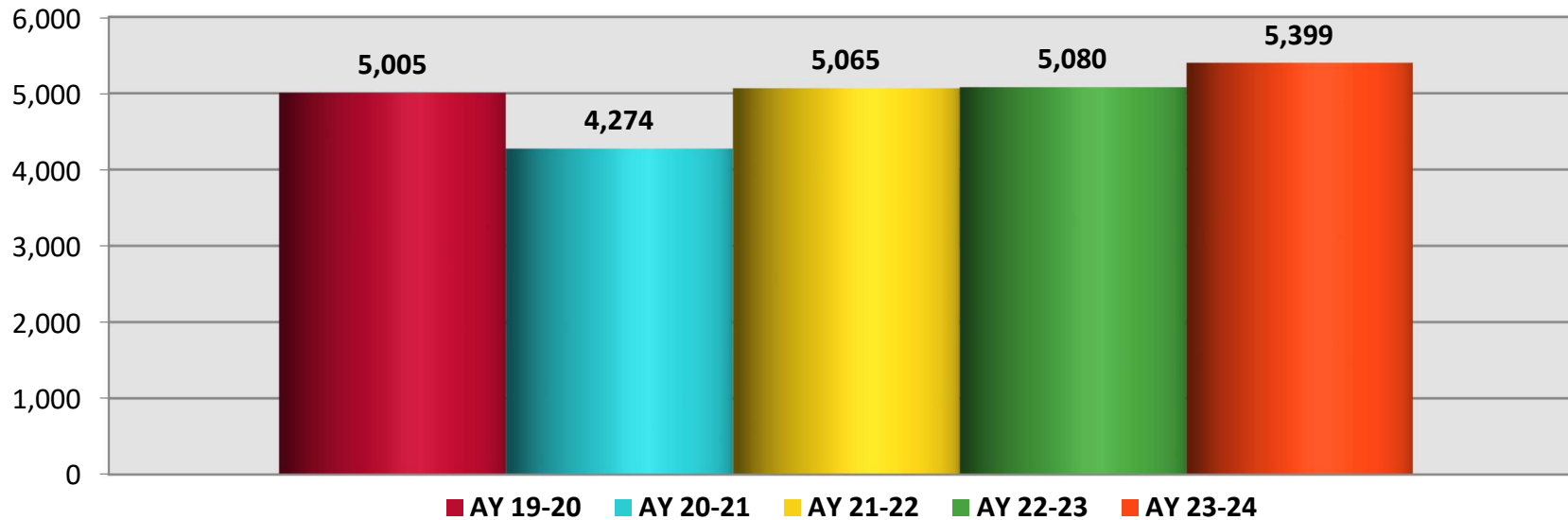

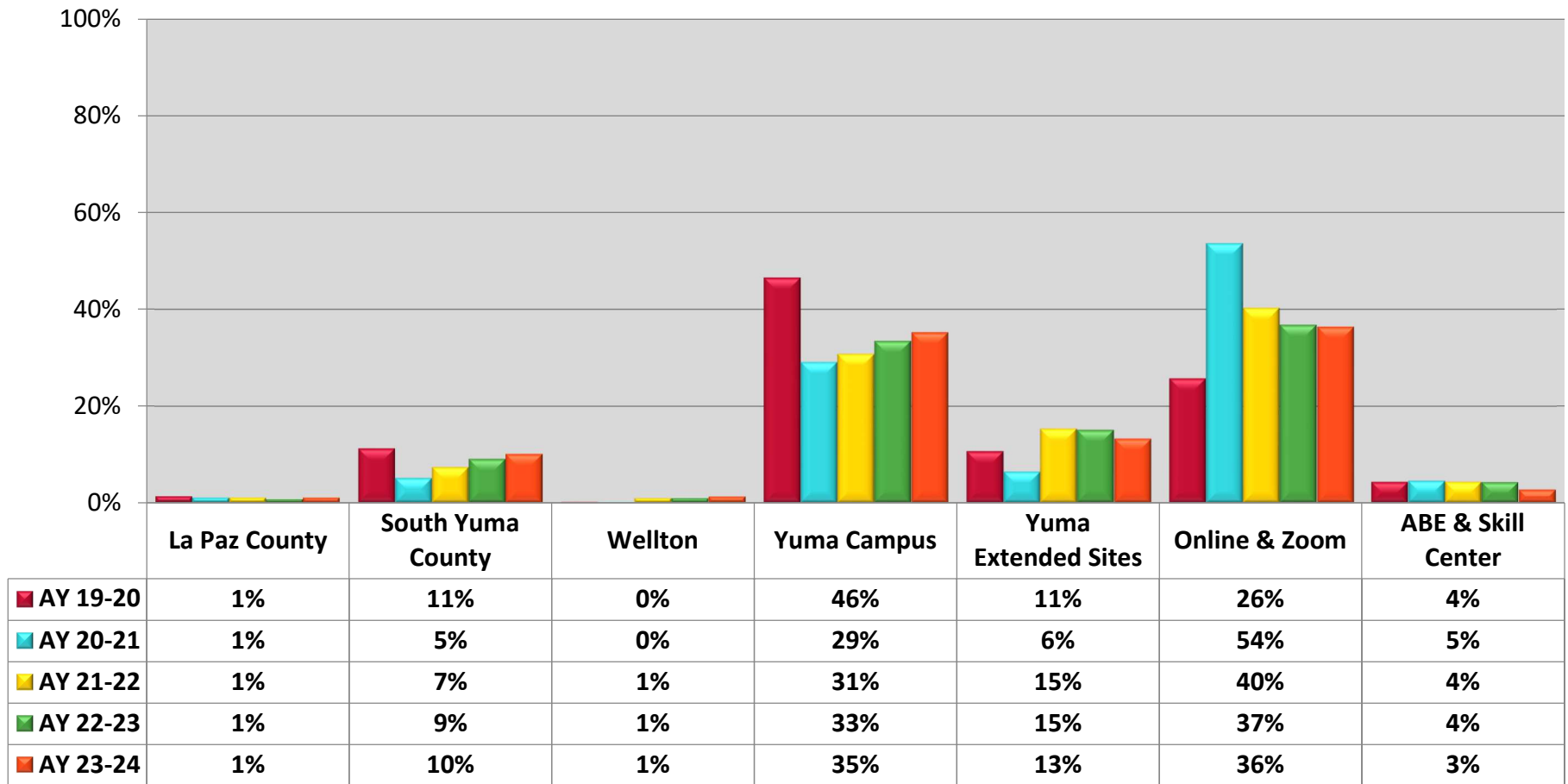

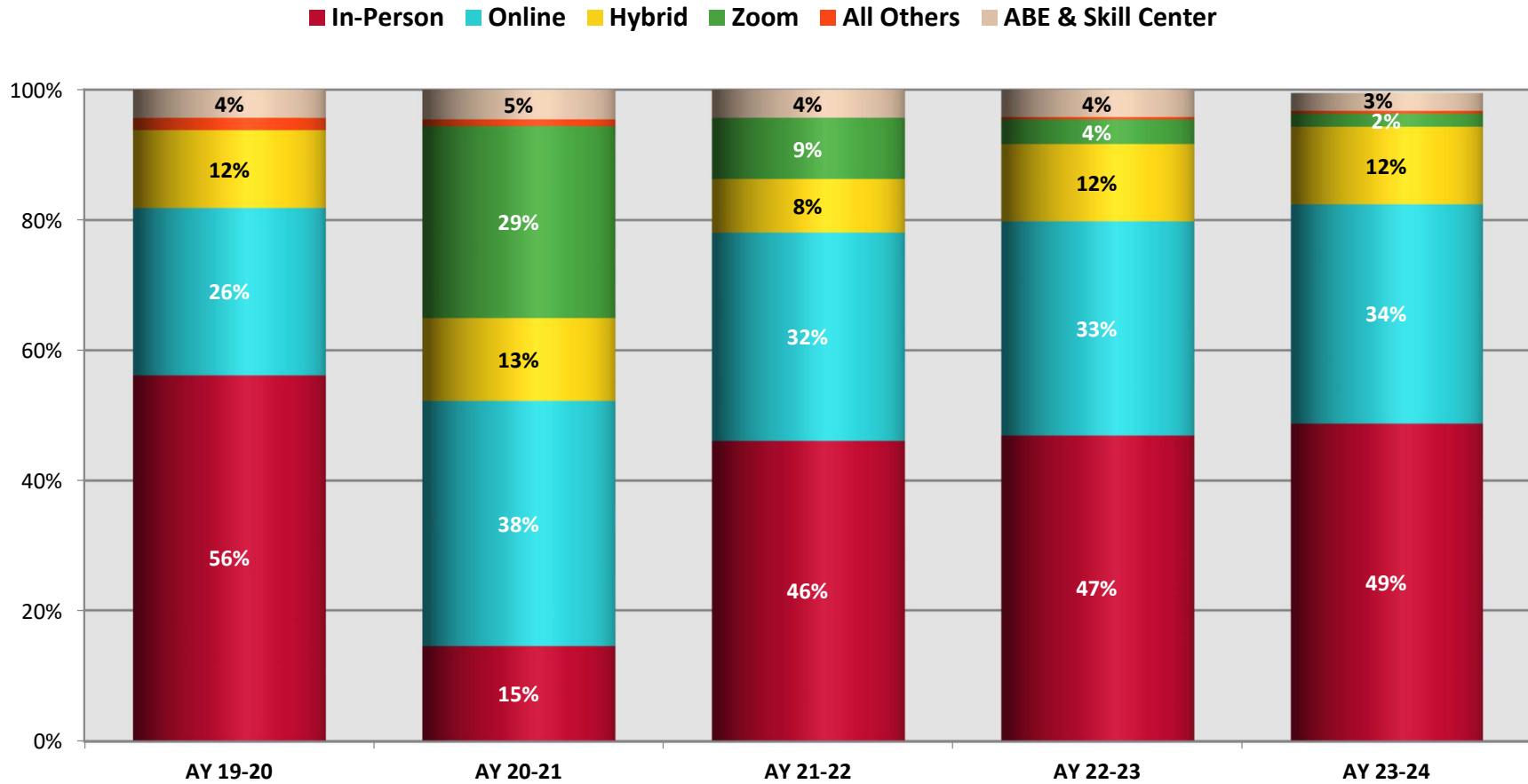

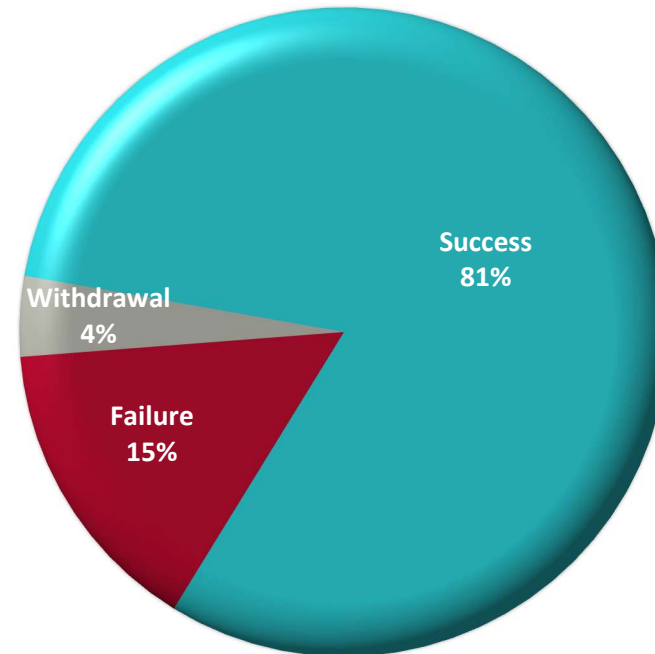

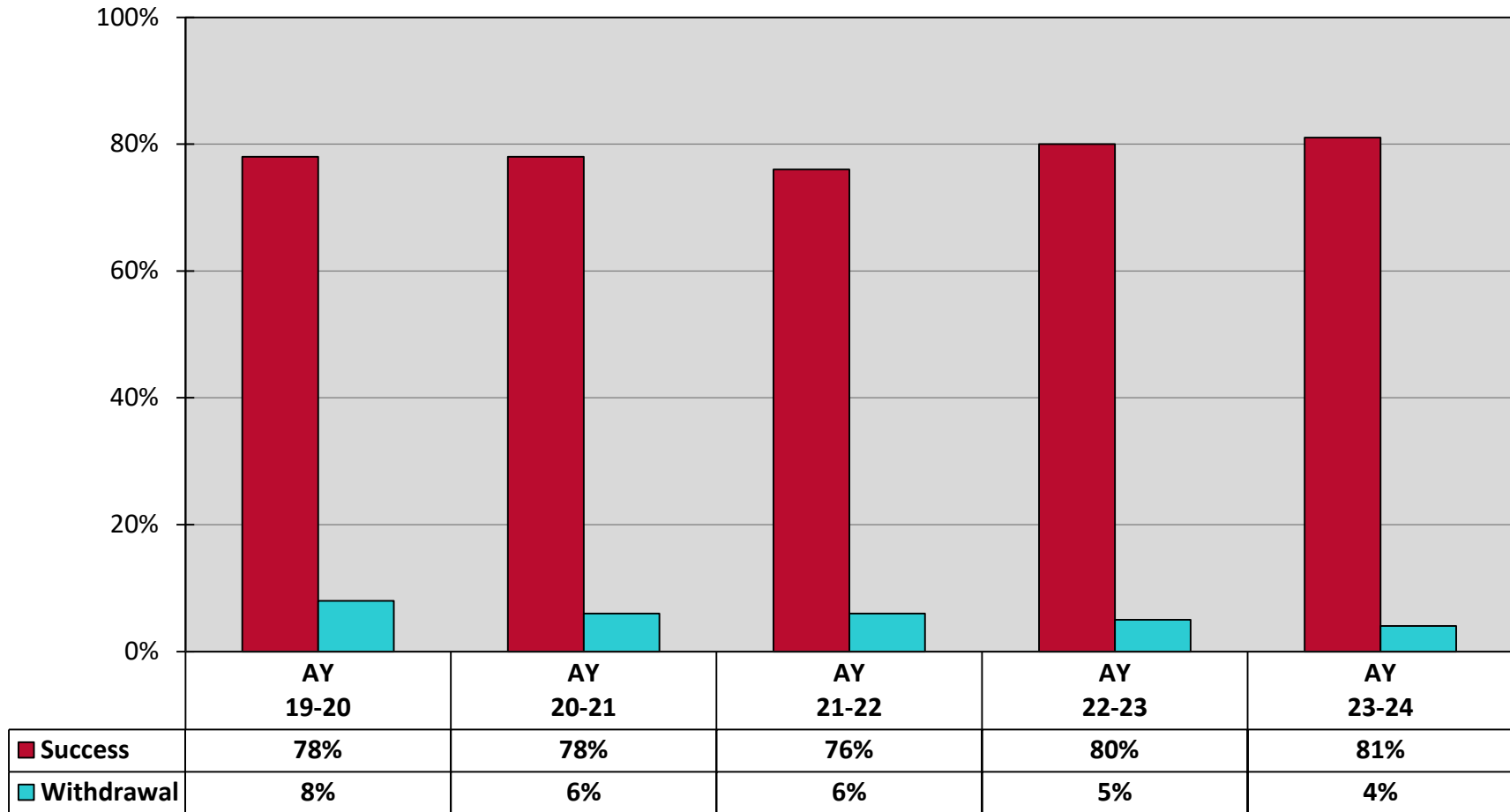

Five-Year Trend of Academic Performance¹

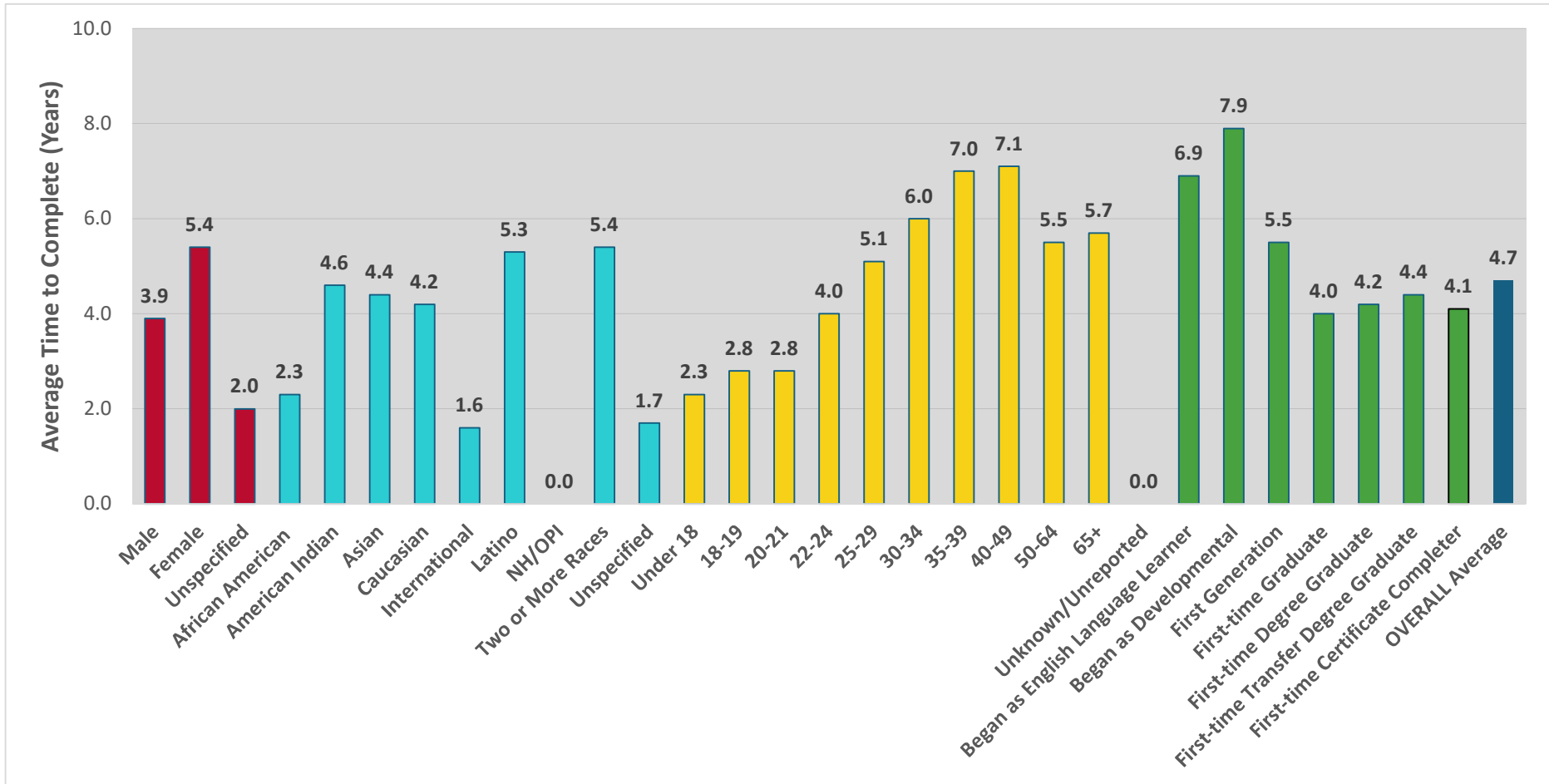

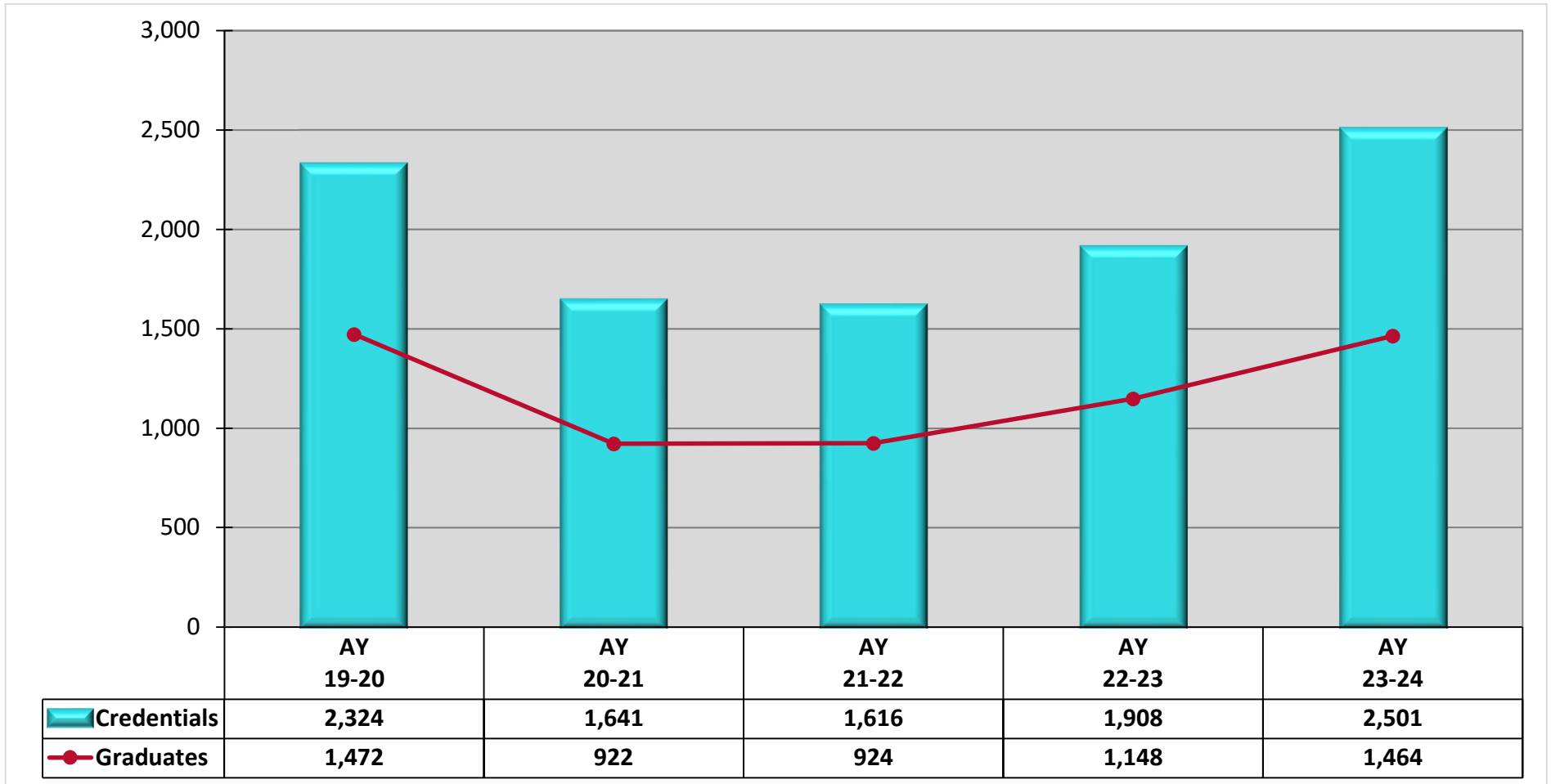
AY 2023-2024 Graduate Efficiency Rate

Five-Year Trend of Graduates¹ & Credentials Awarded²

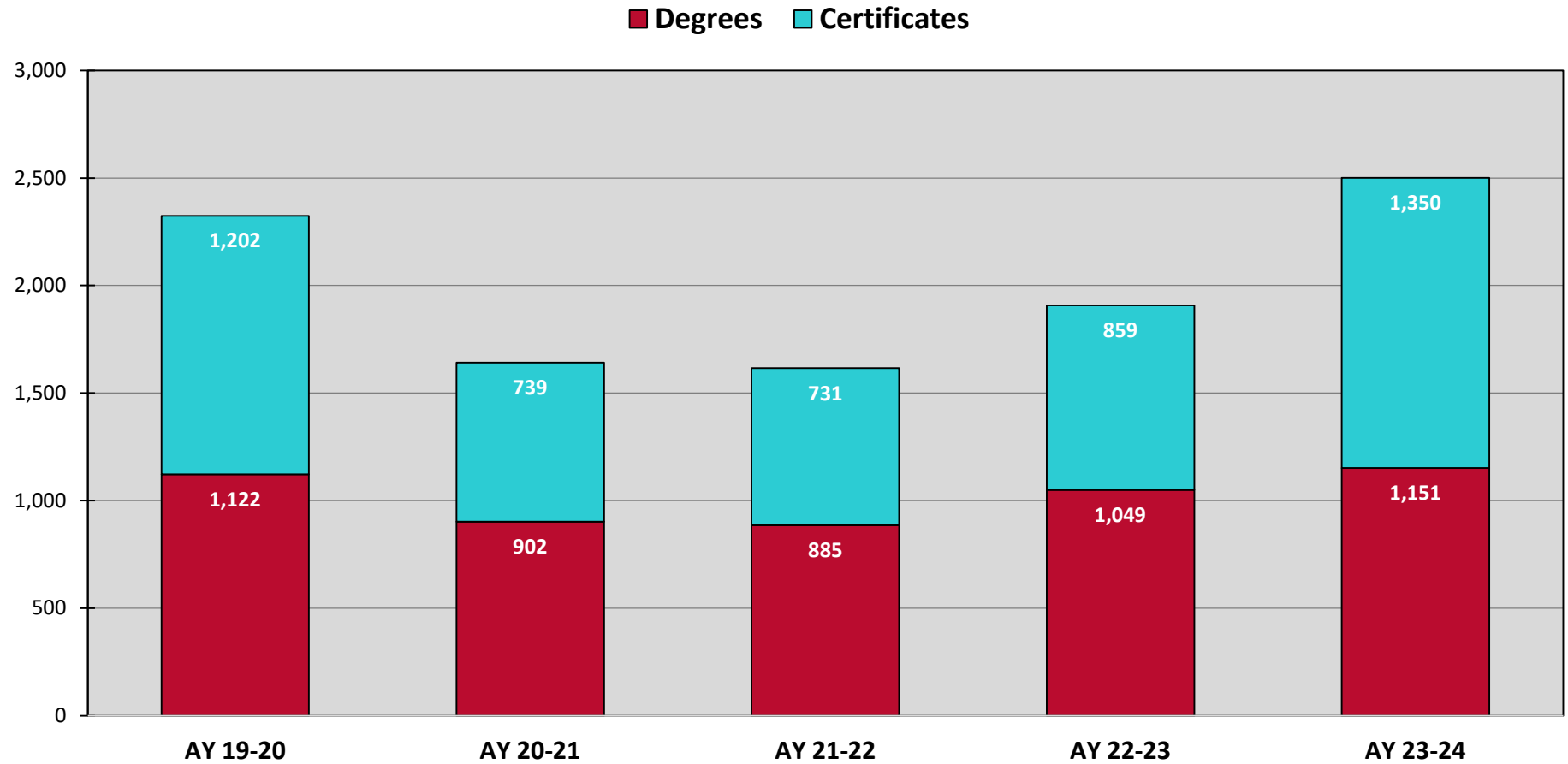

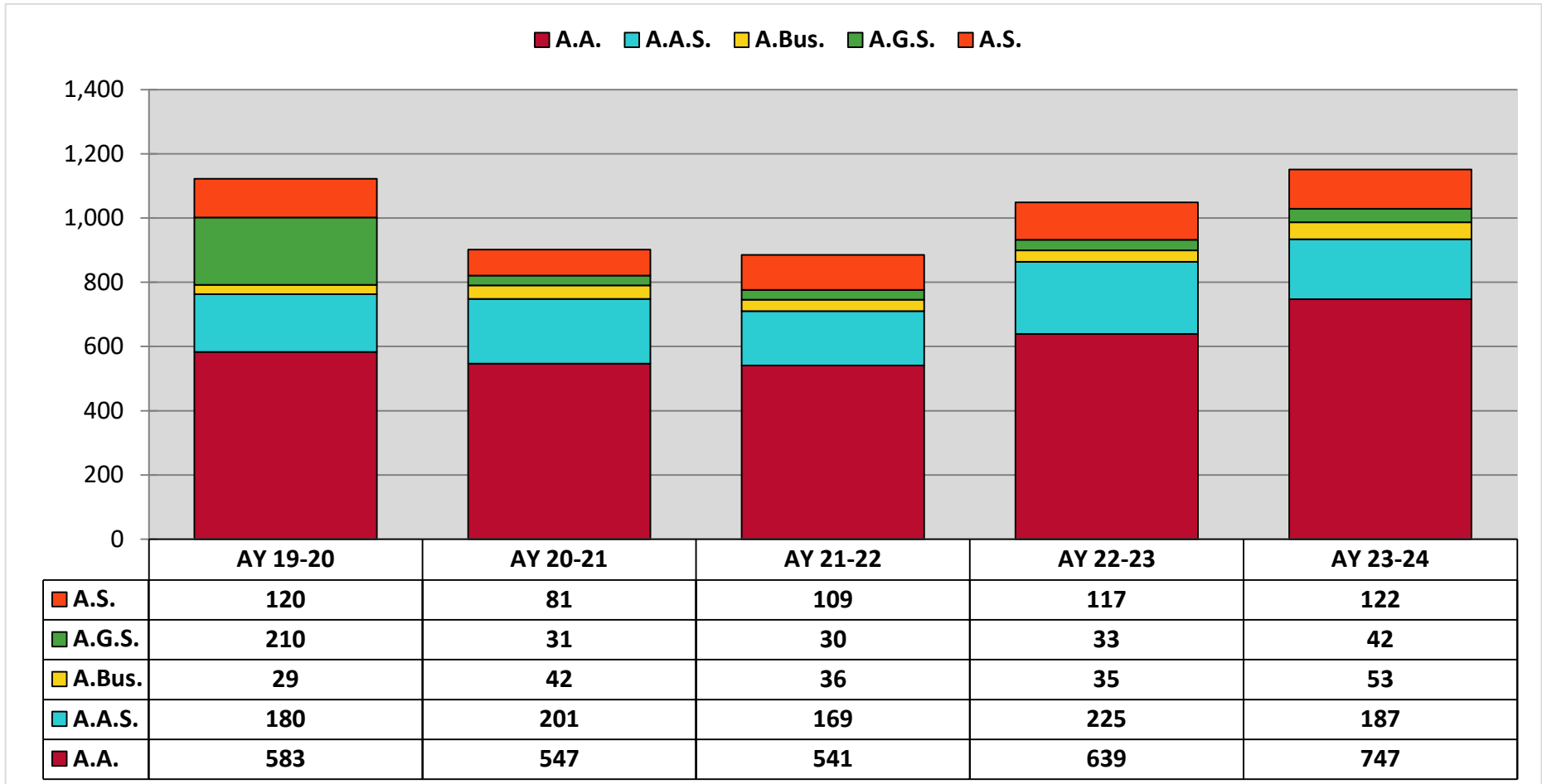
Five-Year Trend of Degrees & Certificates Awarded by Credential Type

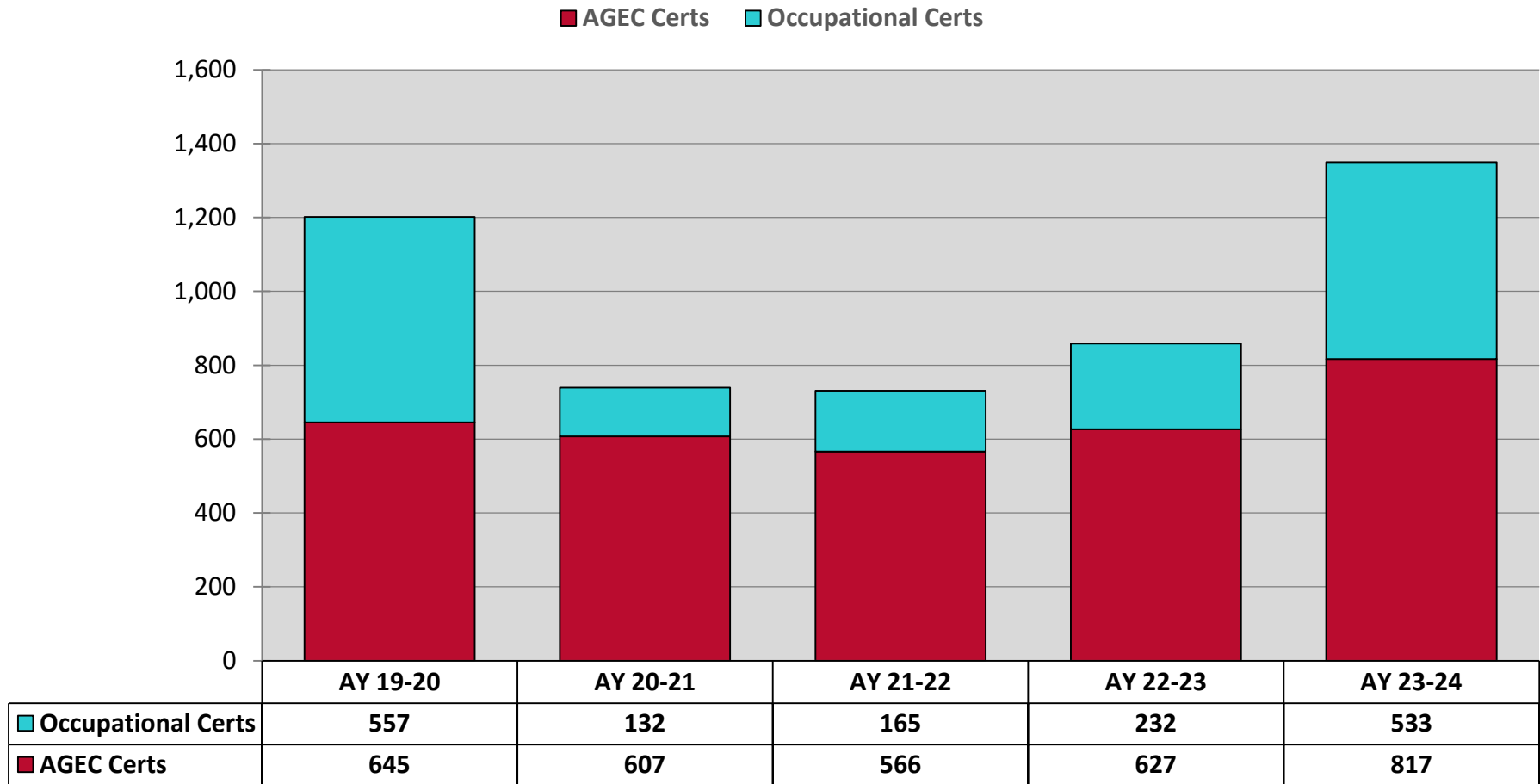
Five-Year Trend of Degrees Awarded by Degree Type

DEFINITIONS OF DATA ELEMENTS

Academic Performance

Academic performance is evaluated through several key metrics:

Grade Distribution: the range of final grades awarded across courses, highlighting academic outcomes.

Completion Rate: the percentage of students who complete their courses, receiving any final grades except those indicating withdrawal or non-completion (AU, I, IP, AW, W, or NS).

Calculation:

- The numerator is the number of students who received final grades of A, B, C, D, F, CR, or NC
- The denominator is the number of students who received final grades of A, B, C, D, F, CR, NC, NS, AW, or W

Note: grades AU (Audit), I (Incomplete), and IP (In Progress) are not included in this calculation

Success Rate: the percentage of students who achieve a grade of 'C' or better in their courses, indicating satisfactory performance.

Calculation:

- The numerator is the number of students who received final grades of A, B, C, or CR
- The denominator is the number of students who received final grades of A, B, C, D, F, CR, NC, NS, AW, or W

Note: grades AU (Audit), I (Incomplete), and IP (In Progress) are not included in this calculation

Withdrawal Rate: the percentage of students who withdraw from courses after the initial enrollment period, marked by grades AW and W.

Calculation:

- The numerator is the number of students who received final grades of AW or W
- The denominator is the number of students who received final grades of A, B, C, D, F, CR, NC, NS, AW, or W

Note: grades AU (Audit), I (Incomplete), and IP (In Progress) are not included in this calculation

DEFINITIONS OF DATA ELEMENTS

Academic Year (AY)

An academic year extends from July 1 of one year to June 30 of the following year, including the summer, fall, winter, and spring terms/session.

Age Groups

Determined based on students' date of birth as reported, where age is calculated as of the start date of the given Academic Year (July 1). These age groups align with the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) categories, which are commonly used for reporting purposes.

Attendance Classification

A 'Full-time (FT)' student is actively enrolled for twenty-four (24) or more credits for the entire academic year. A 'Part-time (PT)' student is actively enrolled for less than twenty-four (24) credits for the entire academic year.

Certificate-Seeking Student

A student enrolled in courses for credit who is actively pursuing the completion of an occupational certificate. This includes both full-time and part-time students who have declared their intention to obtain a certificate.

Declared Major Student

A student enrolled in courses for credit who has declared their intention to obtain a degree or certificate or is attending for personal enrichment purposes. This includes both full-time and part-time students.

Degree/Certificate-Seeking Student

A student enrolled in courses for credit who is actively pursuing the completion of an academic or occupational degree and/or certificate. This includes both full-time and part-time students who have declared their intention to obtain a degree or certificate.

Degree-Seeking Student

A student enrolled in courses for credit who is actively pursuing the completion of an academic or occupational degree. This includes both full-time and part-time students who have declared their intention to obtain a degree.

DEFINITIONS OF DATA ELEMENTS

Developmental Student

A student who is enrolled in any developmental courses at any time during the given academic year. Developmental courses include reading, English, and math that are below college level. Specifically:

- Reading (all courses)
- English 100 or lower
- Math 121 or lower, except for MAT-105, MAT-106, and MAT-119

English Language Learner Student

A student enrolled in any ESL or EAP course at any time during the given academic year.

Enrollment Headcount

Enrollment headcounts are duplicated, meaning each class enrollment is counted individually.

First-Generation Student

A student whose parent(s) or legal guardian(s) have not completed a bachelor's degree. A student who is the first in their immediate family to attend college/university.

First-Time Student

A student who had no prior postsecondary experience attending any higher education institution and who enrolled at AWC for the first time at any point during the given academic year.

Gender

The gender identity (e.g., male, female, unspecified) as self-reported by students at the time of enrollment or updated during their academic duration.

Graduate

A student who has been awarded a credential, such as a certificate and/or associate degree, at any point during the given academic year.

DEFINITIONS OF DATA ELEMENTS

Graduation Efficiency Rate

The average time, measured in years, that it takes for students to complete their degree or certificate program, starting from their initial enrollment at AWC and ending in the specified academic year.

Modalities

Course delivery modes include:

- Hybrid: Classes are delivered both on-campus (in-person) and online, combining face-to-face interactions with online components.
- In-Person: Classes are conducted exclusively on-site at AWC locations, with all course activities carried out in person.
- Linked: Classes are delivered simultaneously to multiple AWC locations via Zoom.
- Online (Web-based): Classes are conducted entirely online using Canvas, without any scheduled in-person sessions.
- Zoom: Classes are delivered live via Zoom virtually, with all students joining virtually in real-time.
- Zoom In-Person: Classes are delivered live via Zoom to students at an AWC location who attend in person.

Race/Ethnicity

Student race and ethnicity are categorized according to IPEDS standards. These classifications help ensure consistent and comparable data collection across educational institutions and aid in reporting to federal agencies.

- African American: Includes persons having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
- American Indian: Includes persons having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintain tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- Asian: Includes persons having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- Caucasian: Includes persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
- International: Includes individuals who are not U.S. citizens or nationals and who are in the United States on a visa or temporary basis and do not have a right to remain indefinitely.
- Latino: Includes individuals of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

DEFINITIONS OF DATA ELEMENTS

- **Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander (NH/OPI):** Includes persons having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
- **Two or More Races:** Includes individuals who identify with more than one of the above five races.
- **Unspecified:** Includes individuals who do not report their race and ethnicity, as well as those who decline to specify their race or ethnicity.

Students Awarded Pell

A student who was awarded at least one Pell Grant during the specified academic year, which targets students in financial need.

Students Awarded Any Financial Aid

A student who was awarded at least one financial aid award, including Pell Grants, during the specified academic year.

Student Headcount

Student headcounts are unduplicated, where each student is counted only once, regardless of the number of classes they are enrolled in during a given academic year.
