COURSE DESCRIPTION

Skills acquired in Digital Photography I will be enhanced. Through the medium of digital photography, students will develop a personal philosophy articulated through their photographs. Advanced aesthetic theories will be explored and students will assemble a portfolio.

- 1.1 Develop an advanced knowledge of digital imagery.
- 1.2 Explore modes for integrating computer technology to the photographic enterprise.
- 1.3 Develop skills for commercial application of digital photography.
- 1.4 Increase sensitivity to photography as art.
- 1.5 Develop an avenue of self-expression with life long potential.
- 1.6 Perfect techniques of image manipulation in the digital photo lab.

- 2.1 Understand the digitizing process.
- 2.2 Understand and use acquisition parameters for standard input devices.
- 2.3 Enhance and redefine existing images.
- 2.4 Analyze image structure.
- 2.5 Develop models and macros for multiple image processing.
- 2.6 Understand the processes involved in video imaging and processing.
- 2.7 Integration of multiple images on multiple layers.
- 2.8 Develop a series of images used in a campaign.
- 2.9 Work within the graphic interface of various equipment.
- 2.10 Focus on translating a personal vision into photographic images.
- 2.11 To increase understanding of various aesthetic theories in the context of discussing photography, art, and philosophy.

6. <u>STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES</u>
