MUS 145D BRASS INSTRUMENT- TUBA 1A

Credit Hours: 2 cr, 1.2 lec/lab

PREREQUISITE: instructor permission required

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This is applied music, an individual one-hour per week lesson designed to develop college-level performing skills on the tuba. This course is required of music majors whose major instrument is the tuba.

1. COURSE GOAL

The lessons provide one-on-one instruction with the goal of improving a student's technical and musical skills.

2. OUTCOMES

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 2.1 demonstrate a strong, secure embouchure.
- 2.2 demonstrate clear and precise articulation.
- 2.3 control and refine tone production over the range of the instrument.
- 2.4 demonstrate technical proficiency.
- 2.5 demonstrate flexibility.
- 2.6 demonstrate accurate intonation.
- 2.7 demonstrate a refined concept of musical interpretation.

3. METHODS OF INSTRUCTION

The course is a one-on-one private lesson.

4. LEARNING ACTIVITIES

- 4.1 An individual lesson will be provided each week of the semester.
- 4.2 Scales, etudes, solos, and method books will be used for instruction.
- 4.3 Sight-reading exercises and duets will augment other study materials.

5. EVALUATION

- 5.1 Grades will be earned by an assortment of learning activities, exams, assignments, and participation.

6. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- 6.1 Under AWC Policy, students are expected to attend every session of class in which they are enrolled.
