PREREQUISITE: MAT 151

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Methods of collection, tabulation, and analysis of business and economic data, including measures of central tendency and dispersion, probability theory, frequency distributions, statistical inference, and statistical decision making.

- 1.2. Apply statistical concepts.
- 1.3. Demonstrate business and personal decision making using statistics.
- 1.4. Correlate economic and statistical data for decision making.
- 1.5. Utilize computer tools to aid in the aforementioned concepts and applications.

- 2.2. demonstrate basic formularies in decision making.
- 2.3. use statistical formulas in business applications.
- 2.4. use statistical formulas in personal applications.
- 2.5. use spreadsheet software for statistical functions.

6. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES
