1 JRCERT defines not actively seeking employment as: 1) graduate fails to communicate with program officials regarding employment status after multiple attempts, 2) graduate is unwilling to seek employment that requires relocation, 3) graduate is unwilling to accept employment, for example, due to salary or hours, 4) graduate is on active military duty, and/or 5) graduate is continuing education.

2 In 2017, one student took ARRT exam and passed on first attempt but was from previous graduation class, resulting in 80%, with 15 students taking exam and 12 passing on first attempt.

3 In 2018, one student took ARRT exam and passed on first attempt but was from previous graduation class, resulting in 53%, with 17 students taking exam and 9 passing on first attempt.
