MFG 185 QUALITY CONTROL AND INSPECTION

Credit Hours: 3 Lec 2 Lab 2

PREREQUISITE: None

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Survey of quality control and inspection including: precision measurement, inspection techniques for non destructive and destructive testing, sampling plans, investigation methods, and assessment of process variables and controls used in the materials joining / welding manufacturing industry.

1. COURSE GOAL

- 1.1 Acquire an understanding of Quality Control, inspection, precision measurement and quality assurance management used in materials joining manufacturing.
- 1.2 Develop the elementary mastery of techniques, procedures and methods associated with skills and industrial practices associated with quality control used in materials joining manufacturing.

2. OUTCOMES

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 2.1 describe and discuss the parameters, variable and factors associated with non destructive testing (NDT), and destructive (DT) inspection and testing for quality control.
- 2.2 prepare the more common control charts, records and procedure documents used in industry.
- 2.3 explain the role and importance of variability and reliability as it relates to major materials joining process variables.
- 2.4 develop and prepare materials receiving, materials joining / welding procedure specifications and in process inspection documents using a recognized industry code such as the American Welding Society Structural Steel welding code.
- 2.5 conduct an investigation of a materials joining / welding qualification test specimen or manufactured product and develop the required inspection specifications, conduct the inspection and report the results as part of a class and or individual project.
